Dear MSA Members,

It was announced today that the **Winnipeg Metropolitan Region** has been moved into the province's Restriction Level (Orange) beginning Monday, September 28th.

The Manitoba Soccer Association, following provincial health authority guidelines of maximum group sizes of 10 people, has determined that in order to keep our players, coaches, referees and volunteers safe, we will be moving that region of the province into Stage 2 of the Manitoba Soccer Return to Participate Outdoor & Indoor Guidelines and Recommendations. In Stage 2, soccer training may take place with group sizes of 10 and including limited contact throughout. Competitions are prohibited as of Monday, September 28th.

We will remain in Stage 2 for a minimum of 4 weeks to coincide with the provincial health authority orders. We realize that some members are completing the outdoor season, while others are beginning preparation for the upcoming indoor season. We are hopeful that we will be able to start the indoor season after the 4-week restriction period.

The following areas of the province will be in Stage 2 ***beginning on Monday, September 28th***:

City of Winnipeg;
City of Selkirk;
Town of Stonewall;
RM of Cartier;
RM of Headingley;
RM of Macdonald;
RM of Ritchot;
RM of Rockwood;
RM of Rosser;
RM of Springfield;
RM of St. Andrews;
RM of St. Clements;
RM of St. François Xavier;
RM of Taché;
RM of West St. Paul;
RM of East St. Paul;
Town of Niverville; and
Village of Dunnottar.

All other areas of the province remain in Stage 3.
